

Psalm — Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel (Isaiah 12).


Second Reading — Rejoice! The Lord is near. Make your requests known to God (Philippians 4:4-7).

Practical suggestions for the Corporal Works of Mercy

At the invitation of Pope Francis the church has entered into a Jubilee of Mercy. It is a special year of grace to enable the church, individually and institutionally, to model the mercy of Jesus that ought to characterize the life of everyone who bears the name Christian.

Talk of a Jubilee of Mercy evokes long dormant memories of catechism lessons about the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. These admonitions are to help us live out our Catholic identity by practical acts of kindness that advance the physical (corporal) needs of our fellow human beings or their spiritual and emotional wellbeing. They embody the actions and attitudes one would associate with the compassion of Christ.

The six of the seven Corporal Works of Mercy emanate from Matthew 25:31-46, the judgment parable of the separation of the sheep. The seventh Corporal Work of Mercy is inspired by the Book of Tobit. During this Advent/Christmas season people are naturally drawn to deeds of kindness, especially to those in need. That makes this the perfect season to reflect on the Corporal Works of Mercy.

Feed the Hungry

- Since charity begins at home, see to the proper nutrition of those within your own household;
- Support with your time talent and/or treasure our parish based St. Vincent DePaul Conference, Andre House and other services that directly provide food to those in need;
- Educate yourself on issues of hunger locally, nationally and globally;
- Don't waste food.

Shelter the Homeless

- Assist in the ministries of Catholic Charities refugee resettlement or Habitat for Humanity;
- Support the Red Cross who helps people rebuild their lives in the aftermath of natural disasters;
- Advocate for legislation and public policy that provides housing for low-income people;
- Consider being a foster parent.

Clothe the Naked

- Include socks or scarfs or gloves in your Shoebox for the Homeless sponsored by the OLV Women's Club;
- Clean out your closets and dresser drawers for those usable clothing items and shoes you no longer wear and donate them to service agencies like St. Joseph the Worker and Andre House, that make them available to people who really need them;
- Participate in programs that provide blankets, jackets and sleeping bags to the homeless.

Visit the Sick

- Visit friends, family or parishioners who are sick and homebound and feeling isolated or disconnected;
- Call, e-mail or send a card to someone who is ill or homebound;
- Offer to drive someone to a medical appointment or pick up their medication at the pharmacy;
- Become a Minister of Care to the homebound who bring Holy Communion and a physical link with the parish family they can no longer come to on their own;
- Volunteer at a hospital or care facility.

Visit the Imprisoned

- Find out about diocesan sponsored ministries to the incarcerated and consider volunteering;
- Support programs and agencies that advocate for those unjustly incarcerated;
- Support job training and educational programs to help rehabilitate those in prison;
- Pray for the families of the incarcerated;
- Advocate for the abolition of the death penalty.

Give to the Poor

- Make regular donations to those who give direct assistance to the poor and needy, especially St. Vincent DePaul, Andre House and St. Joseph the Worker
- When you hear the sound of the bell at the Salvation Army red kettle during this time of year, give what you can.

Bury the Dead

- Pray for family, friends and parishioners who have died recently;
- Attend wakes (vigils) funerals of family, neighbors or parishioners;
- Offer to prepare a dish for parish funeral brunches;
- Be with the grieving and visit cemeteries;
- Have Masses offered for deceased loved ones.

The Jubilee of Mercy calls upon each of those to embody the compassion of Christ in our interaction with one another. Consider how you might embrace the Corporal Works of Mercy not just in the Christmas season, but in every season. In the weeks to come we will visit the Spiritual Works of Mercy.
