

#### Company is coming!

During this festive time of year it seems there is a lot of company coming. Christmas is the perfect season for opening our homes and welcoming friends and extended family to share our table. What is true of our homes is equally true of our church community. Our hospitality is the hallmark of this season, and every season, and we are delighted to have the family in our house today.

Since just before Thanksgiving I have experienced a resurrection of cousins unrivaled in the nearly forty years I have been based in the west and the southwest. Hailing from hearty Midwestern stock in northern Indiana the harsh winters and the lake effect snow (that lake would be Lake Michigan) makes the desert southwest the "go to" destination of many winter weary folks.

Prior to Thanksgiving cousins I had not seen in 40 years tracked me down through the internet and our parish website. Bob and his sister Jean, and their spouses Kathy and Scott, were in the area and wanted to get together. Bob and Jean are really second cousins; their grandmother was my mother's oldest sister. Jean is my age, although she went to the public high school and I went to the Catholic high school. Growing up, however, cousins were just cousins. The last time I saw them was at my ordination 40 years ago.

On Wednesday they called to inform me they would be at the Thursday morning Mass. Knowing how the passage of time takes its toll, I wondered how I would recognize them after four decades. I decided to look for their parents! As it turned out, the years have been very good to Bob and Jean and I recognized them immediately. Because of Confessions and a previously scheduled doctor's appointment I regret that I was only able to spend a few minutes with them. I was delighted to hear that Bob and Kathy moved to Sun City West and was even more pleased when they accepted my invitation to join our combined parish family for our Thanksgiving Day Mass a week later.

In the middle of Advent two other cousins announced their Phoenix arrival with the hope of getting together. Their mother was my mother's youngest sister. Jack operates an old fashioned walk up window Dairy Queen franchise in northern Indiana, affording him four months off in the winter. It has been about three years since Jack and I last connected during his swing through Arizona. This year his sister traveled with him. Jane lives in North Carolina. We haven't seen each other in 15 years since the celebration of my Silver Jubilee celebrations in Indiana.

In both cases, while the encounters were brief, it was like unearthing long lost family relationships. The cousins are now older than our parents were when we were growing up in Indiana, but the rekindling of the family bond was energizing. Brothers from my Holy Cross family also visited in the Advent days. Each year every Holy Cross religious is formally visited by one or more of our Province leadership team. This year two of our assistant provincials visited our community on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. While Br. Donald has visited here before, it was Fr. Bill's first visit to my ministry at St. Raphael and Our Lady of the Valley. He was keenly interested in knowing all about my solo ministry in the desert and wanted to see both parish campuses and my residence. He even met the First Lady of the parishes, Lady Raphaella of the Valley. Both of my Holy Cross brothers were grateful for the kindness shown them by parishioners at the holy day Mass and seemed pleased with what they found here. My Holy Cross family is every bit as important as my blood family, and, no, they did not come bearing Fiesta Bowl tickets.

While there is never really a "down" season in the church business, everyone knows that the Advent-Christmas season is especially busy for a Catholic parish (not to mention two parishes). From Thanksgiving, through Christmas and into the New Year the Catholic community is in high gear with the beautiful Advent season and the celebrations of Christmas that also includes Holy Family Sunday, the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God and the beginning of the New Year, the wonderful feast of the Epiphany and concluding with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. When the secular and commercial world pulls the plug on Christmas before Christmas Day is fully expended, the Catholic community is just lighting up the Christmas celebration. I urge all our households to continue to savor the light and the warmth of Christmas for the three weeks encompassing the Christmas season. As well. I hope you also have the opportunity to rekindle the bond of family ties with the coming and going of family and friends this time of year.

This year the winter version of Ordinary Time bridging Christmas and Lent encompasses a mere four Sundays. That fourth Sunday is Super Bowl Sunday. Hopes of the inclusion of the Arizona Cardinals in the high holy day of professional football may make that Sunday as festive as Christmas for the red bird fans. Hope springs eternal!

In this season of "company is coming," we warmly welcome all who come to share the great events of the Christmas season with our parish community. You are family and family is always welcome at our house.
